In poker game, the word steal is frequently used as simply a synonym for bluff, but there is a more particular application of the word which is as well named an "ante steal" or "blind steal" (according to whether the game being played employs antes or blinds in Las Vegas Poker tournament).

To steal is to raise with a hand fewer important than what might usually be measured a raising hand, usually a lower standard one, with the expect that the few players residual will not contain a hand value calling the raise, thereby winning the antes or blinds without additional action. This play is applied moreover in late position subsequent to numerous players have folded, or while the game is short-handed. Steals occur most frequently in tournaments due to the increasing ante/blind structure per tournament poker strategy.

Whilst steals like this don't succeed lot cash for each hand, they can build up to significant income if the players to the left of the stealer are tight sufficient to not challenge many steals. Certainly, expert players will know frequent steal plays and often reraise for protection in the poker tournament casino.

Steals being completed in late position or while the game is short-handed are the most general steals, but a raise below other conditions can perform as a steal as well. An aggressive player, particularly one with a big stack of chips, might reraise somebody he recognizes might be attempting to steal. The purpose here is twofold in live poker tournaments.

The re-raiser expects to choose up the blinds and antes and the raiser's chips while the raiser folds. And the re-raiser expects to maintain this player from continually raising prior to she/he can perform as that cuts down on the raiser's chances.
